‘Globalising educational dialogues of practitioners who are seeking to contribute to the flourishing of humanity in the process of exploring the implications of asking, researching and answering, ‘How do I improve what I am doing?’ We are doing this by generating, enhancing and sharing our living-theories and developing living-cultures-of-inquiry. An individual’s living-theory is their explanation of their educational influences in their own learning, the learning of others and the learning of social formations.’

When – **Saturday, 7th November 2015, 10:00-11:30 UK time** – 11-12:30 in Pretoria.

The event will be physically hosted in Bath, UK and linked to the ALARA workshop in Pretoria, South Africa, led by Sonia Hutchison and linked through SKYPE. If you cannot be at one of those venues you will be able to participate through multi-screen SKYPE.

Although only a few people can take part in the event through SKYPE we can extend the possibilities of new connections being made by drawing attention to your work through your living-poster and making it available at and after the event if you:

1. Create and upload a 2 minute video-clip to YouTube of you talking about the essentials of your: context; interests; research passions and; the values that give meaning and purpose to your life and work. These

are your lived and living values that form your explanatory principles and living standards of judgment to which you hold yourself accountable in your practice.

2. Send us a pdf of an attractive A4 'poster' which includes brief details of your: context; interests; ontological and relational values that motivate you; research passions; details of a few of your key publications; the url to your website if you have one; your contact details and the url to your YouTube video.
