


Figure 3b. Moodle links to portfolio requirements and its construction within the *Confluence* wiki template

Note that the Skills Assessment Template (SAT) is an important tool within the study of the six Core units and in constructing the e-portfolio. The completed Skills Assessment Template is the basis for the CTP e-portfolio, in which the student is required to make a valid claim (i.e. backed by evidence) that they understand their own educational development as they endeavour to improve their ability to work as reflective practitioners and improve their understanding of the construction industry within a global setting. The e-portfolio is constructed on a template provided in a Confluence wiki site accessed through the Moodle virtual learning environment. The portfolio is subjected to formative assessment after studying Units 1 and 2, peer assessment after studying Units 3 and 4 and summative assessment at the conclusion of Unit 6 study.
