I am a person who holds certain values relating to freedom and justice; I try to express these values in the form of my life - however, the circumstances of my life can often cause me to deny these values in practice.

I am an educational researcher who generates <u>living-theories</u> as values-based explanations for my educational influences, in the process of researching questions of the sort *How do I improve what I am doing?* As part of this process, I attempt to make claims that I understand my own educational development.

A recent thumbnail <u>autobiography</u> includes some of the significant experiences of the past 70 years that have formed my values and guide my actions. The context for the Living Manual

The <u>Blueprint Alliance</u> was formed in late 2014 following the death of <u>my son</u> who was an early developer of the integration of sustainable systems that support autonomous human settlements.

There are five essential elements to all human habitation: Shelter + Water + Food + Waste Management + Energy Supply ... to which *purposeful and valued work* must be added.

The current work of Blueprint is to integrate these elements into settlements for refugees and other displaced persons - settlements that regenerate the lives of the people who live in them and the land on which they stand.

The purpose of the Living Manual

- To be an educational resource to all those who engage with it
- Available through a fully-responsive website that is accessible across smartphones, tablets and PCs

- A reference for the humanitarian sector that builds bridges between deep ecology and relief work.

The Living Manual and Living Theory

The Living Manual is Autopoietic - as in a self-regulating and self-producing living organism. Users of the living manual act as knowledge-carriers and creators who add to its body of knowledge.

Users of the living manual wish to regenerate people's lives and the land on which they live: driven by values relating to social justice, they are researching questions of the sort *How do I improve what I am doing?*

While they are not *explicitly* expressing their living-theories as explanations of their educational influence, users of the Living Manual are *implicitly* expressing their living-theories in the form of the structures and living systems their research with the Manual leads them to construct.
